KEY STEPS TO PRAYING THE PRAYER OF COMMAND

Ask the person “How may we pray for you?”

Listen to their request and brief story

Ask the individual about the pain level they are experiencing right then, with 10 excruciating pain and 0 no pain. This helps give them a way of measuring the pain level as it decreases through prayer!

Share with them that you will be using the Prayer of Command

Pray Prayer of Command, taking no longer than a few minutes

Take a ‘time-out’ from praying and ask them if they notice any difference

Ask them, “Has the pain decreased any or is it still the same?” “Is the pain still a 7 or has it decreased?”

Do not be discouraged if the pain level is the same. Jesus teaches us to persist. Give thanks for the healing (by faith) and use Prayer of Command once again.

If the pain has decreased any at all following 1st or 2nd Prayer of Command, be encouraged, give thanks and pray Prayer of Command a 3rd time.

Pray for the Holy Spirit to continue the healing process to its perfect completion during the coming night and day.

Pray Prayer of Command, taking no longer than a few minutes
